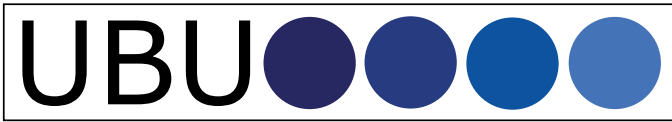

### COUNT

RON appears on all ballot papers in exactly the same way as other candidates, and reaches the quota of 50% plus 1 of the votes cast, then no-one is elected to the post. Instead, nominations are re-opened and a by-election is held.
