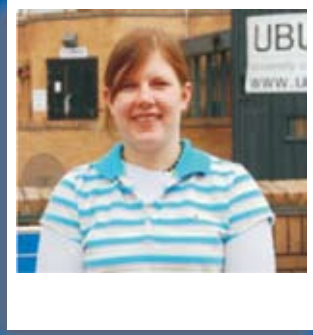

Reviews

MAXIMO PARK - Our Earthly Pleasure

Though lacking any songs to the standard of 'Apply Some Pressure', the second album by Newcastle band Maximo Park is overall a better collection of songs than their debut effort. Lead single 'Our Velocity' easily deserves to be in the 'best of 2007' list with its multi-layered vocals, and other singles 'Books From Boxes' and 'Girls Who Play Guitars' share equal status. 'Unstoppable' is a highlight of the album for me and almost reaches the heights of 'Pressure'. Overall, a great album with lots of lyrical and musical hooks.



Now 67 review

You can always rely on the Now! series of albums to deliver a good collection of the latest pop songs and this volume is no exception and actually above average compared to previous releases.

With a handful of number ones, including the perpetual chart-topper 'Umbrella' by Rihanna, this release healthily mixes in the likes of 'Take That' and 'McFly' with 'Calvin Harris', 'Timbaland' and 'Fall Out Boy'. With entries to suit every musical taste, this is a definite purchase for the chart followers of 2007.



THE WHITE STRIPES YOU DON'T KNOW WHAT LOVE IS (YOU JUST DO AS YOU'RE TOLD)

Returning to the sound of their previous album 'Get Behind Me Satan', this is a classic White Stripes track with the usual trademarks of deep lyrics, raw guitar and a catchy chorus. Lacking the manic rock of previous single 'Icky Thump', this still manages to be a ballad with edge.



THE CHEMICAL BROTHERS THE SALMON DANCE

Easily the weirdest and most drug-influenced track of the year, mixing in an off-tune riff with a laid-back rap about dancing like a salmon swimming upstream, interspersed with factual snippets about the fish. In the hands of any other band it would be dismissed as cheese but somehow, the Chemical Brothers manage to make it appear as post-modern irony.



Starlight Express @ Alhambra

On August 16th at 7.30pm I was fortunate enough to accompany a group of 24 pre-university international students (organised by myself) to see the fantastic Andrew-Lloyd Webbers Starlight Express Musical at Bradford's



Alhambra theatre. It was a great opportunity for the students to see a spectacular London musical at Bradford prices.

Starlight Express was an original, impressive artistic piece, full of song dance and acrobats, amazingly all on roller skates. The fact that as you enter the theatre you are given 3D glasses to view the train races adds excitement. The musical commences in a child's dream where a racing tournament between trains is taking place on a model track. Characters introduced represent different imaginary train types, who enter the World Championship Race. The main characters who are established are Grease Ball the arrogant

American slick diesel train (who has a high resemblance to Elvis Presley), played by Tom Kavanan, Electra, the enjoyable, camp electric train (who also has a resemblance to Gary Glitter), played by Mykal Rand and finally charming Rusty, the steam train played by Kistofer Harding. Other trains from Germany, Japan, Russia and the United Kingdom (who disappointing pulls out of the race last minute and so we do not get to see in action) also make an appearance.

Rusty dreams of winning the world championship race but to his fellow competitors this is mere a dream, they see Rusty as an old fashioned slow train. Rusty is however in love with Pearl the

observation carriage, played by Gemma Atkins, but when he approaches her for a date she turns him down and runs the race with Electra. However, as predicted Rusty the underdog finally wins and in turn wins Pearl's heart.

The plot of the musical, the love between Rusty and Pearl I found was weak and predictable. Even so the eclectic nature of the musical makes up for this slight down fall, and has the ability to maintain the audience's attention. The songs were able to appeal to a wide range of tastes such as Rock and Roll, real Rhythm and Blues, Hip-Hop, pop, country and to my surprise even some Gospel (where my heart lies). Dinah the

dining carriage train, played by Lucy-Jane Adcock gives a very comical and witty rendition of the song U.N.C.O.U.P.L.E.D, Michael Samuels who played the wise old Papa gave an embracing and soulful performance. Whist the Hip Hoppers kept the musical upbeat, by bringing the streets to the race tracks.

The choreography and acrobatics were exciting and amazing. The musical as a whole was vibrant and energetic, keeping the audience on their toes. I thoroughly enjoyed the show and would recommend you to go and see it at a train track near you.

Bradford Student Walks Length Of Country For Charity

Being back at Uni is always strange after being away for the summer holidays, but this year settling back in is even more difficult. That's because for the last three months I've been living out of a rucksack as I've walked the length of the country for charity!

Starting at the end of May, the 1,250 mile route took me and my Dad from Lands End, the 'bottom left-hand corner', to John o'Groats, the 'top right-hand corner' and beyond to Muckle Flugga, the most northerly point of the UK. The expedition was to raise money for the Royal Society for the Protection of Birds (RSPB), a conservation charity with over 150 reserves in the UK.

We saw some of the most stunning scenery of the UK, including the South West coast, the Lake District, the Highlands of Scotland, and the Orkney and Shetland Isles- two remote island archipelagos north of the Scottish mainland. We saw wild red deer, jumping salmon, harbour porpoise (imagine a small dolphin), red squirrel and seals, as well as numerous sea birds.

But it wasn't all fun and games. As well as the duration, we had to put up with river crossings, mountains to climb, biting insects of

various kinds, one of the wettest summers on record and the continuous threat of exhaustion!

In total, the expedition has raised £2000 for the RSPB, and donations are still coming in thick and fast! 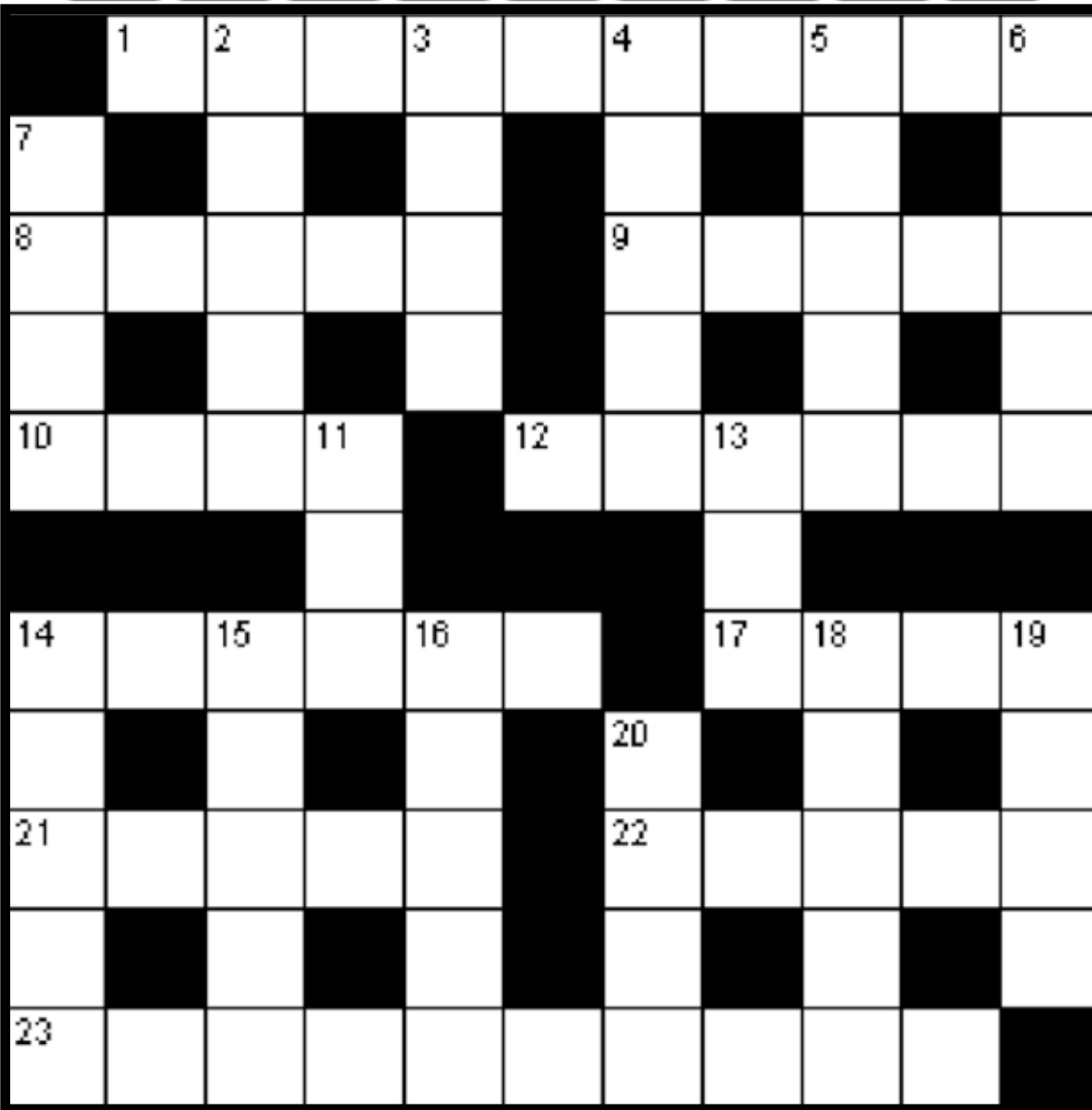
